Community Development Practice in New Zealand: Exploring Good Practice is an edited volume of case studies and projects that illustrate how community development practitioners in New Zealand from a wide range of areas have attempted to give voice to the less powerful whose voice is often ignored and excluded from governance policy and decision-making processes. The book also engages with the critical question of the nexus between theory-practice-research and knowledge generation in a discipline that seeks to achieve community well-being outcomes through participatory processes.

The book is intended for a wide readership, including community development professionals, policy makers, funding organisations, students and teachers, as well as those who may simply want to enjoy good stories of successful engagement of the community development approach to understanding society's issues.

Dr. Love M. Chile is Academic Director of the Centre for Community Investment and Development, and Co-ordinator of Postgraduate Studies at the Institute of Public Policy, AUT University. He works primarily in community development, the human services and refugees and migrant developments. He was the Programme Director for Social Practice in the School of Health and Community Studies at UNITEC New Zealand from 1997 - 2004, a programme that trains professionals in Social Work, Community Development and Counselling.
